## a) Draft Mission and Vision

### **MISSION**

We are a voluntary, inclusive group of concerned cyclists working to make cycling in Winnipeg a safe, enjoyable, accessible and convenient transportation choice year-round.

### **VISION**

We envision a city where cycling is embraced as the preferred mode of transportation, where cycling is integrated into urban design and planning, and where Winnipeg is recognized as a leader in cycling infrastructure and programs.

## b) Strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats

#### **Strengths**

- recognized as a strong cycling advocacy group
- broad spectrum of talents
- we're all cyclists first hand experience
- represent different groups can take message further
- value mutual respect
- grassroots, co-operative, voluntary
- non-partisan, no need to tow party line

### Weaknesses

### **Threats**

- being co-opted by bureaucracy
- negative press

- cycling not recognized as mainstream, legitimate form of transportation (both Katz and Doer)
