1.Welcome, Introductions

2. Committee Reports

a) DISRAELI

The plan for Disraeli is to redevelop the existing structure and include a 6 foot sidewalk and 3 foot shy zones across the bridge for cycling/pedestrians. The car lanes are going to be 3.5 meters (12 feet).

Comments made in meeting:

- We are hopeful that whatever bike route decided upon for Disraeli can be extended to Main Street.
- Can we get the shy zone increased to 5 feet and call it a bike lane? Best-practices says that there needs to be 4 feet minimum for a space to be considered a bike lane.
- We would like to see them steal part of the traffic lane to make a larger (at least 4 foot) bike lane / shy zone.
- As a cyclist how can you get off of Disraeli and onto Anabella?
 You'd have to take an off ramp...
- Can we ask that the city actually create a BIKE LANE and not just a shy-zone ideally we would like to see something separated?
 - Bill Larkin from the city would likely be a champion on this topic.

Action (individuals): E-mail thoughts of what cycling considerations you'd like to see built into the re-development plan for Disraeli to Phil (bikesandbeyond@shaw.ca) soon so he can provide input to committee

Action (Provincial Committee):

Rob Altemeyer made a comment regarding how the Province is giving the city a considerable amount of money to advance their agenda of Healthy Living and Active Transportation and when these considerations are not integrated appropriately into plans for redevelopment of major routes the Province should be made aware of this. Therefore the BTTF Provincial Committee should consider:

- Raising this issue with Provincial Cabinet ministers when we have a follow-up meetings. A key follow-up would be with Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Steve Ashton about expanding the shy zone by a foot.
- We could also mention this to other Cabinet Ministers such as Infrastructure and Transportation (Ron Lemieux) and Healthy Living (Kerri Irvin-Ross)

b) LOGO

We reviewed the logo designs that Anders put together and each had the opportunity to share thoughts about the logo. Anders agreed to redevelop some more logo templates which we can use to choose the final one.

After Anders left, we discussed the logo colours and some more details. While there was some interest in a variety of colours in the logo, we decided to get a good black and white one ready for use before we worry too much about setting and locking down colour schemes. (North America can be gray).

Eventually we would like to have a full colour version for the web (and other uses where colour is practical). Also, we are assuming for the time being, that we will be printing these on a white background. Although we may need the inverse style logo in the future.

c) MARCONI

Don English presented on Marconi and the recent developments of the River East Transcona Trails Committee. The documents and notes from his presentation are attached to the minutes. Of special note is that they will be presenting to the East Kildonan-TR Community Mtg Monday March 19 at 5:30pm 755 Henderson Hwy.

d) WINSMART / survey

Winsmart will be developed in 2 phases from the Forks to Jubilee.

- Phase 1 will be this year and will involve paving the trail that runs from the Forks (by the Norwood Bridge) to the South Osborne underpass. The trail will be lighted and signed.
- Phase 2 will be developed next year from South Osborne underpass to Jubilee and Pembina
 - Only barrier is the fence by MTS building they'll negotiate or have to expropriate

Action: The Winsmart consultation committee would like to get comments from the community about this development. They have prepared a survey and are circulating it to interest groups in Winnipeg. Tim will compile comments from Bike to the Future members and make an overall comment from BTTF based on the survey results. 3. B2F Committees

a. City

Committee met with Kerri Irvin-Ross (Healthy Living) and feel that in general it was a good meeting. She is aware of Bike to the Future and seems supportive, but was non-committal about specific requests. We asked her to support a provincial bike policy and she said she'd see what she can do.

Molly and Curt Hull met with Jane Gray (a mover and shaker bureaucrat) who works for the Climate Change Branch of STEM (Science Technology Energy and Mines). She suggested that we bring our idea of a Provincial Bike Policy to the Deputy Minister's office of Climate Change (John Clarkson's office) to get the bureaucrats working on this concept. Molly will follow-up with Neil Cunningham.

Rob suggested we should get in contact with these folks as above – should we try and meet with the province once per month in strategizing for election time?

We should probably expand who we are in contact with rather than with face-to-face meetings at this time.

The Provincial Committee needs more volunteers – Curt Hull has stepped up!

Action: Anyone who is willing and able to take an active roll on the Provincial Committee should get in touch with Molly or Jackie Molly to follow up with Neil Cunningham about the Bike Policy.
