10. CentrePort - cycling (Kevin)

- This is a provincial project in Northwest Winnipeg. Ted Mann would like to form a committee to approach CentrePort and offer to attend meetings to offer expertise about how cycling could fit into these plans. David Wieser is also interested in this.
- We should probably question whether this initiative should even exist. This project will essentially build a freeway in NW in Winnipeg, which is cause for concern.
- Any cycling advocacy should be done through the St James-Assiniboia and West Central Commuter Cyclists community cycling groups, not Bike to the Future, because these groups represent the needs of the community's cyclists. We should request to see the Transportation Plan before we choose a position. Kevin will contact Ted.

14. \$20M of funding for bicycling infrastructure - update (Gareth Simons & Anders Swanson)

- Nothing much new. Kevin Nixon is thinking of sourcing some jobs to consultants to get the ball rolling to implement these projects.
- We need to emphasize "complete streets" policies for City of Winnipeg plans, and get ahead of the design phase to make sure things are done well.
- The input of local community cycling groups is vital.

15. BttF Membership Database (Ruby on Rails) – IT volunteers needed (Kevin)

16. Mountain Equipment Coop Partnership Agreement for 2009 (Kevin)

- MEC requested a meeting with Jackie, Kevin, and Curt. They asked about our needs, and we asked for some help with administrative help (to write grant applications, etc). MEC subsequently offered us a 3-month contract (Nov to Feb). Kevin summarized the contract. It includes a 'club night' for members, the ability to sell our memberships in their stores, a grant to hire temporary staff, and other things. Where on our website does MEC want their logo/link? What is the payment timeframe for the grant? (Kevin has contacted MEC to ask.)
- Early in 2009, we (Membership Committee Director Rob Cosco) expended a lot of time and energy building
 relationships with bike shops -- see "<u>http://biketothefuture.org/get-involved/join-bike-to-the-future/membershipcard-and-participating-bike-shops</u>". We should ensure MEC knows we are not exclusive partners with anyone. If
 we sign the MEC contract, we should also extend similar partnership opportunities to the bike shops. Our website
 should include the logos/links of all bike shops we partner with; the size could vary by level of funding.
- Kevin will circulate the contract to all directors. (Done, and a lot of discussion has ensued.)

- There was a lot of discussion and ideas about the actions our Provincial Committee should take. (For example, BttF should suggest specific changes to the Highway Traffic Act and/or publically suggest the HTA be reviewed.)

20. MPI and adult cyclists (Jackie)

- Adam Keedal from MPI contacted Jackie. MPI Executives have directed him to prepare a report on the current state of what MPI is doing for cyclists, and what they could do for adult cyclists.
- This is an opportunity to provide a "wish list" of what could happen, which includes what's happening here, what's happening elsewhere, and what could happen here.
- Jackie will share an existing document with Adam, CC our Safety and Education Committee, and open dialogue.
- Potential for putting cycling safety workshops in the Leisure Guide.

23. Bus Rapid Transit (Gareth)

- There was a meeting last week with the consultant. Some details about the AT pathway are still being worked out. Solid connections are lacking on some parts.
- There's a cycling safety problem at the Donald & Stradbrook intersection because northbound Donald cars can turn right onto Stradbrook on a red light, so northbound cyclists are vulnerable to a "Right Hook". Gareth wants that "right on red" removed. He would also like to see a "Copenhagen Left" for southbound Donald cyclists.
- Just south of Confusion Corner, there will be a bidirectional pathway on the east side of Pembina, and cyclists will cross Pembina at Jessie.

24. Disraeli Bridge and Overpass Rehabilitation (Brion)

• As a result of the extra \$60million in funding from the Provincial government, the work of the Disraeli Rehabilitation *Collaborative Planning Working Group* report has been shelved, but the process was still positive.

Provincial Committee report – Jeremy Hull

Meeting with Minister Jim Rondeau

On October 8th I met with Jim Rondeau, Minister of Science, Technology, Energy and Mines at his invitation, along with representatives of Green Manitoba, the provincial agency responsible for implementing a number of environmental initiatives. Minister Rondeau was asking for input, via the recently formed Active Transportation Advisory Committee, concerning what actions we would like to see the provincial government take in the short, medium and longer terms. He sees the need for a series of reports from this committee that would identifying measurable goals, and identify the progress government is making on them. He emphasized that his department can help by legitimizing our issues and pushing them with other departments, and that Green Manitoba can take the priorities established by the advisory committee and turn them into reports. But first we need to lay out our vision for the province and identify the goals and issues that we see. This suggests the need for BttF to hold a strategic planning meeting to come up with an adequate response.

NDP Leadership Candidates Survey

A set of questions on cycling issues was developed by Anders and me and forwarded to the NDP candidates. Responses were received from both remaining candidates and have been posted to our web site. Both candidates gave positive responses.

Selinger quote: "I agree that we need to take a much closer look at opportunities to promote and encourage cycling as a serious transportation alternative. As NDP leader and Premier, I will want to work with all interested parties to move this forward and dedicate resources to it."

Ashton quote: "As Minister I was able to work with my colleagues to fund bike paths and to fund the historic first Rapid Transit/Active Transportation corridor in South Winnipeg. As a candidate I have further committed to extend this to the East Rapid Transit/ Active Transportation Corridor."

City Committee report – Mark Cohoe

City of Winnipeg Budget Preparations

Osborne Bridge Rehabilitation

The Osborne Bridge Rehabilitation Neighbourhood Advisory Committee (NAC) has met twice so far. See http://biketothefuture.org/about/bttfs-city-committee. I have some concerns that the city has not budgeted enough money to improve the bicycle facilities over this bridge. The next meeting on October 28th should provide us with a good sense of what will be included in the project. At that time, we may need to take action to seek additional funding for the project in the budget process.

I will be keeping people up to date on this through a monthly report at Bike to the Future's monthly meetings and through regular postings to One Green City. I will be setting up a page on Bike to the Future's web site to gather all of the relevant information into one area. I would also like to set up an informal meeting to be held the second Monday following the NAC meetings to discuss opportunities for the bridge. I think 7:00 PM at the *Toad in the Hole* will be workable. Please let me know if you want to attend these meetings. The meetings would be held October 19th, November 9th, November 30th, and December 21st.

Fort Garry Bridges

The AT path is over the river is now open. The connections need to be completed. I believe that the connection on the east end of the spans south of Bishop Grandin is the only one that has been competed.
