6. Issues

- a. Helmet position There has been a lot of recent news about helmet legislation. Email discussion as well as discussion at the meeting has led us to think we need to a more in-depth conversation on this issue. It has been moved to the May meeting.
- b. Cycling *Bill of Rights* An excellent document has been circulated between board members. Added to, adjusted. This could be the document that defines us.
- c. Pembina Underpass Jackie East presented on the conceptual stage of the process. Please see Mark's City Committee report for further information.
- d. Public Utilities Board Jason Carter, President of the Manitoba Cycling Association, recommended that BttF seek intervener status at the Public Utilities Board for the purpose of further establishing BttF's identity and presence with respect to Manitoba Public Insurance. We could ask for social marketing for cyclists in a similar fashion that the motorcyclists have done.

7. Other Items

a. Tom attended a meeting with provincial Infrastructure & Transportation (MIT) staff about electronic hand held devices. They propose making it illegal for cyclists to use these devices, just as it is illegal for motorists to use them. He and others attending the meeting opposed this on the grounds that it is not a priority compared to the real issues affecting cyclist safety, such as motorists passing cyclists too closely.


City Committee report April 2012

Pembina Highway Meeting

I met with City officials on March 20, 2012 to look over Pembina Highway options, provide input, and help select a preferred option. Four options were looked at:

- Buffered bike lanes in the curb lane
- Two way bicycle path on the east side of Pembina
- Two way bicycle path in the median
- · Buffered bike lanes in the median lane

The general consensus at the end of the meeting was that the buffered bicycle lanes in the curb lane provided the best option. The city is planning to complete the construction this summer for the section of Pembina between Crescent Drive/Chevrier and Plaza this summer. Bollards are still being looked at as a separator between the bike lane and the travel lanes.



Osborne Bridge Update

The second phase of the Osborne Bridge Rehabilitation Project has begun. As a result, traffic across the bridge is one again restricted. The good news is that this year there has been no flooding of the river, so the pathway beneath the bridge remains open. Unfortunately, the current construction plan has also closed off access to this pathway from the west as Mostyn (now named Granite) has been closed off to westbound traffic. I have sent an email to Kevin Nixon and Darren Burmey asking for the following modifications to the construction plan:

- 1. That westbound Granite/Mostyn be opened up for bicycle traffic
- 2. That a temporary bike lane be added to southbound Osborne where the barricades end (at the south end of the bridge) to allow a better transition to Roslyn.
- 3. That the Maryland bike lane and Maryland Bridges shy lanes be properly swept so that cyclists can use this as an alternative to Osborne.

Safety and Education report April 2012

Can-Bike Training

The 12 successful candidates for the Can-Bike 2 course have been chosen and the course dates have been set. In total there were 21 individuals that completed the application for the course. The application process was required in order to have some basis for selection. Of the 12, one is a BttF Director (Mark) and 2 are female. All 12 have very good qualifications in terms of both cycling and instruction experience.

The dates for the course are April 29, May 13, and June 2. Based on discussions with MPI they are hoping to see these 12 new instructors start very quickly with providing workplace champion training. At this point no specific dates have been set, but MPI has expressed interest in starting as soon as possible.

MPI Agreement

The presentation and handout materials for the workplace champion courses are approximately 80% complete. The presentation materials, while branded BttF and being delivered by BttF members/instructors, have required some changes to reflect MPI's slightly more conservative approach to items such as riding 1 meter for the curb and taking the centre of the lane. The handout materials were originally to be branded BttF, however after numerous back-and-forths over content, revised handouts were developed to reflect MPI's branding, website content, and wording. In this way the handouts both previously developed for BttF and those developed as part of the agreement will remain exclusive to BttF and will result in no conflicts in terms of use at our events, etc.

Planning for the on-road training routes for the workplace champion courses has been completed, however they still need to be ridden before the final maps are prepared. Once complete, BttF can begin billing MPI for the services provided although it may make sense to simply wait until June and bill the entire amount.

Safety Committee on Active Transportation (SCAT)

There has been little progress on the document created by SCAT reflecting safety recommendations for use of the new active transportation infrastructure. Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation (MIT) and the City of Winnipeg Police Service (WPS) still oppose any reference to recommendations of cyclists riding a minimum distance of 1 metre from the curb or minimum safe passing distance. As this document does not represent policy, we have taken the stand that there is no reason that it should not be included. MPI has remained supportive of indicating that "experienced cyclists recommend" these various approaches even though it apparent that they are receiving some pressure from MIT and WPS. Hopefully they remain supportive in this approach and do not change their website materials (which took a great deal of work and discussion to get them there in the first place).

CCA and CAN-Bike

The Canadian Cycling Association submitted a proposal in November 2011 to the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) for recreational cycling safety for children and youth. The proposal called for expanding of Can-Bike instructors certified to provide the "CAN-Bike Kids" program. CCA was successful and is now looking at how they will implement the program. I have had some preliminary discussions with Currie Gillespie, the Recreation and Transportation director (also sits on the national committee for the Can-Bike program) at Manitoba Cycling Association (MCA), regarding how this might be undertaken in Manitoba. There has been some discussion at the national level that rather than the individual provincial associations administering this that they may contract it out. BttF would of course be a logical choice, however we still have to see exactly what the expectations are for the program and further discuss our capacity to undertake this program. It is not known exactly how much funding will be allotted to Manitoba so there is still much to learn before we move forward with expanding our resources for Can-Bike training.


