### **Education Committee**

#### ***Grants***

#### ***Bike Week***

The first Bike Week planning meeting will take place on Wednesday September 17<sup>th</sup>. I hope to expand on what we were able to do this year by following the model of the Point Douglas Art/History tour under the banner of Neighbourhood Discovery tours.

#### ***Public Works Committee Meeting – September 9<sup>th</sup>***

I spoke before the public works and infrastructure renewal committee this morning to voice approval for a recommendation to reprioritize residential sidewalks in high traffic pedestrian areas from priority 3 to priority 2 for the purpose of snow clearing.

I also asked for a similar change with respect to bicycle routes, asking that the committee add a recommendation that Council also approve reprioritization of on and off road bicycle routes, as identified by the Public Works Department in consultation with Card Councillors and appropriate stakeholders, for snow clearing on selected high use bicycle routes to appropriate priority levels.

Jenny Gerbasi asked the public works staff about this, however nothing came from it. We need to include this as a priority for the 2015 budget process, which means we will need to push the city on the creation of a winter cycling network that we can cost out.

Cara Fisher, who has worked with PACM and the WRENCH in the past, but who is now living out of province, worked with the city and stakeholders to develop a potential winter cycling network as part of a Master's thesis. We can use this as a basis for our requests. You can view her thesis [here](#).

## City of Winnipeg Planning Projects

### *Pedestrian and Cycling Strategies*

I have continued to offer feedback on the cycling strategy.

### *Polo Park Infrastructure Improvements*

I discussed the St. Mathews extension during my meeting with city staff on Friday September 29<sup>th</sup>. Two positive things came out of this meeting:

- The city is now looking at bollard protected bike lanes on the stretch of St. Mathews between Empress and Century.
- The city will look at installing a bike lane between Strathcona and Empress.

### *Sherbrook*

I have located a volunteer to help out with graphics for the education campaign. Once we have some graphics and public information ready, I will work with Bike Week, the West Broadway BIZ, West End BIZ, West Broadway Community Organization and the city to disseminate the information.

### *Osborne Rehabilitation*

I discussed the 2015 Osborne Street rehabilitation work during my meeting with city staff on Friday September 29<sup>th</sup>. The planned work was described as a very minimal mill and fill project meant to tide things over until the Osborne Underpass is rehabilitated. Essentially, nothing will happen along Osborne until

### *South Winnipeg Parkway*

The feasibility study looking into the South Winnipeg Parkway connection between Togo and Hay is overdue. I have asked the city to follow up and get the completed study.

## City of Winnipeg Infrastructure Projects

### *North Winnipeg Parkway*

I have been informed that long delayed work on improvements to the section of the North Winnipeg Parkway leading from St. John's Park to the south end of the Redwood Bridge will take place this year. This project will move the trail up the river bank to make it less susceptible to flooding.

### *Sherbrook Bike Lane*

Construction is essentially complete between the north end of the Maryland Bridges and Broadway. Portage to Ellice is under construction. See above for work being done on an education campaign.

## **Election Strategy**

### *iBikeiVote.ca and Candidate Interviews*

Charles and I (along with Jeremy on a few occasions) have made a concerted effort to reach out to candidates in the civic election to discuss cycling issues and opportunities, and to get them on tape answering a set of questions relating to cycling in Winnipeg. It's been a positive experience.

### **2015 Budget Priorities Plan**

Using information from the draft cycling strategy, preliminary answers to our priorities workshop and survey, and my own knowledge, I've put together a package of programs and infrastructure projects I'd like to see us push for in the coming election and following budget process. I will discuss this at the meeting.
